FROM THE PASTOR Adventures, U turns, faith, and a useful Greek word.

I should share this right off. I travel, I camp, I climb, hike, and I pursue adventure. And often (to my dislike) adventure pursues me. And often adventure catches me. And always, always, I learn something from it. Some of my best discoveries of life, faith, and spiritual devotion come from an adventure I pursued or one which pursued and made itself mine. And again, each time, I have walked away with a life lesson. Scripture is the raw material for a spiritual life; our interactions with people and the world (and adventure) refine and define our spiritual life.

This past week I was adventuring (attempting adventure as it turns out, life had other plans) and trailering a sport oriented motorcycle to the Virginia/North Carolina/Tennessee/north Georgia mountains. My plan was to camp (tent of course) and partake of the finest twistiest roads the southern Appalachians could offer up on my bike.

An issue at home made me cut short my trip, but I made it a point to stop and camp at a National Forest campground a little south of Waynesville, NC before heading north. It's a nice place, it has maybe six or seven campsites. This time of year, there were four bear hunters, a huge RV camper, a group of 20 year old hikers, and myself camped there. The cool thing about Sunburst Campground is that it is along NC RT 215, which is an incredibly twisty road that gains elevation dramatically up to the Blue Ridge Parkway. From there, a nice leisurely stroll along the BRP was possible for me before descending 215 south (more twisty turns) toward Rosman, NC and a meet for lunch with my daughter who would come up from South Carolina.



Continued from p.1 who has experienced a U turn (or

two, or three, etc.) in life. The early Church followers had a Greek word for spiritual U turns, the word was metonoia. And when I saw the U shaped warning sign along the BRP, I knew I had to share this spiritual idea of metonoia with my new congregations.

Allow me to quote from a 2017 blog I wrote:

"Metonoia: a Greek word for a change in a person's life from a spiritual experience. Christians think its a result of The Spirit moving within their hearts/heads to make a change in their lives. It's what reading and studying scripture (maybe more study than reading?) and prayer do for a person. It might be what happens when you see a food line and make a promise to donate monthly to a food pantry. It could happen in a delivery room. It might be seeing the joy in the eyes of a child as the family moves into a new habitat house and volunteering or donating for future builds. I have seen these things.

But for sure, a metonoia occurs when a person realizes it is time to make a change and takes those first few scary steps into a new life- the life of following the words and teachings of Jesus."

So I hope and pray as we begin a Christ oriented faith and spiritual journey together, we might always be listening and looking for the Holy Spirit to grant, and give, and pursue us with personal and church wide metonoia. And I pray that we will look for signs of metonoia along the roads of our journeys.

Dear God, let this adventure together begin! Amen.

<u>Pastoral Search Completed:</u> Share the Good News!

On Saturday, September 15, our Primary Pastoral candidate, Pastor Heinz Raidel, held a special service at Faith Baltimore and at Grace Pickerington. After each of these services, Pastor Raidel, along with his wife Anna, spent time with each congregation at a meet and greet event hosted by each church. On Sunday, September 16, each church held a congregational meeting to vote to call Pastor Raidel as the pastor to the 2-point parish of Faith Baltimore and Grace Pickerington. The call vote was successful at each church as well as the approval for the compensation package. Protocol is for the Synod to inform the candidate of the vote results and extend the call if it has been approved by both churches. The candidate then accepts or rejects the call. In our case, Pastor Raidel was very happy to accept the call. He will begin his pastoral duties for both churches beginning November 1, 2018. Thank you for all of those who were able to attend and support these events in each of our congregations. May God continue to guide us as we move forward in this joint venture.

New in the Church Library

The first book added to the church library is <u>The Bible In Art.</u> This book contains a collection of twenty centuries of famous Bible paintings collected and commented on by Clifton Harby. This volume contains 750 black and white illustrations and 12 in full color. Published in 1936, the book still serves to inspire one's faith.

The second book is Cameron A. McKenzie's <u>The Reformation</u>, published in 2017 by Concordia Publishing House. This single volume recounts not one, but the multiple reformations of the sixteenth century. What Luther started led to various reform movements in the Western Church. These produced the major denominations of the present day Church in the west. Reformation, then as now, was a complicated and multi-faceted endeavor.

Both books make for an interesting read.
