"What Would Jesus Do?" A Little More on Demons and Stigmas The Reverend Heinz D. Raidel

On Sunday, June 23rd, I preached on Luke 8:26-39; that was the story of Jesus driving the demons out of a man and into a herd of pigs. I left out a faith and life lesson, and I want to share that with you.

In the course of that message I described "demons" in the context of Luke's writing as things that medical science has not yet explained. The ancients had many, many of those demons as the medicinal arts and sciences were quite primitive at the time.

In the last 2000 years, medical and health knowledge has flowed from God to humans in such a way that much of what was considered to be caused by demons is now treatable. I mentioned that within some of the individual congregation member's lifetimes, TB, polio, Rubella, measles, and mumps have become preventable and treatable, and have lost their status as demons.

I also mentioned that we still have some things which could be considered demons. I named addiction as a modern day demon; we know what addiction is, we know how it destroys lives and wrecks relationships, but medical science has not quite yet figured out how to drive it out of people.

I hope that if you were in church on the 23rd, you remember that one of the points of good news in Luke, (and in my message) was that if Jesus crossed boundaries to drive the demons out in the story, Jesus will cross boundaries to heal and make us whole and well again in our present lives.


The other point of good news in that reading is that Jesus crossed boundaries to help and heal. In Jesus' time and culture, the man he healed should have been shunned and avoided, because the man was considered unclean. The man was a Gentile, he was around dead people, he had a demon; all those things made the man unclean in the eyes and the minds of the Jews, and the Jews were expected to avoid unclean situations. That concept of "unclean" though was not enough of a boundary to stop Jesus from seeing, and helping, and healing people back then. And folks, it should not stop us from seeing, and helping, and healing the unclean in our world.

Now, let me be quite blunt, and in the process save

time; we need to think if we are call-

ing mental health issues "demons," and we need to think that we might be considering folks with these "demons," unclean. If we're attaching a stigma to folks with mental health issues, or if we ourselves are avoiding seeking help or counseling because we have attached a stigma to mental health issues, then we're pure plain and simple, calling it unclean, and we're setting up a boundary we're not going to cross.

And I will leave you with this: we lose 129 people a day to suicides in the US; 22 of those suicides every day are veterans. I will leave to the reader to consider what Jesus would have us do.

- 30 cm ruler (or at least cm on one side)
- Pencil sharpener
- Blunt scissors
- 5 unsharpened #2 pencils bound together with a rubber band
- 5 blue or black ball point pens bound together with a rubber band
- 1 box– 16 or 24 count crayons
- 1-2.5 inch eraser


If you have not yet linked your Rewards card to Grace, please do so ASAP, our account number is QS108. Let's see how much we can earn in the next three months.
