Prophetic Problem Perspectives

First, simmer down, this article is not as technical as the title suggests!

A week before my vacation, (yes I am writing this on my vacation in front of a campfire) I took a motorcycle with a "salvage title" to the Highway Patrol Inspection station in Bucyrus. It's a non-typical bike (Honda PC800 for the gearheads in the congregation) and it has plastic pieces covering everything. Well, as soon as the official inspector saw the bike, she began making excuses for not passing the inspection, and she started telling me over and over that I would have to make a new appointment and bring the bike back. She said I would have to "do this and do that" so she could see the VIN and the federal frame ID numbers. The thought of bringing the bike back, for what would have been a third time, was straining my good Christian disposition.

But then a second inspector came out with a flashlight and a wiping rag, and asked if I could remove a cover here and a cover there. In very short time, (due to his tenacity with the flashlight and his cell phone cam) he found what he was looking for and he noted the needed numbers.

I was telling this story to my son; he manages sub-contractors for a large home builder. He looked at me and said, "Problem pointer outer, or problem solver, which one gets the job done?" You can see the relevance of that to my inspection situation.


And that made me think of the Pharisees, Priests, and Sadducees who were constantly straining Jesus' good Christian disposition. (I am not sure that's possible but work with me please.) It seems like a person from one of those groups was always trying to call Jesus to task; "You can't heal people on the Sabbath," "you can't sit with sinners," "you can't feed all these people." And how about this one from the crucifixion scene: "If you're really the Son Of God, then you could save yourself!" These folks were serious problem pointer outers.

But Jesus healed on the Sabbath, and explained it was what he was there for. Jesus fed the 5,000 with a few fish and loaves of bread because they were hungry. Jesus got down and dirty, and healed and saved sinners because they needed healing and saving. And Jesus went to the tomb with our sin because that's how God's

Pickerington Food Pantry & Lancaster Lutheran Social Services Food Pantry

Here is an update on both food pantries:

Thank you for your generosity in supporting the piggy banks for both food pantries, and also your food contributions.

Each month we alternate our the recipient of our piggy bank collections. The food pantries can double the money we send when they purchase food from the mid- Ohio food bank. So if you give \$10 to the food pantries, they can purchase \$20 in food.

What these food pantries cannot purchase is health and beauty items. Things such as shampoo, toilet paper, toothpaste, tooth brushes, feminine pads, diapers, and deodorant.

We strongly recommend that we continue to donate money to the food pantries so they can double their food buying power; and that we contribute health and beauty items to the baskets. You can still donate the food, but keep in mind that health and beauty items are desperately needed. A visit to a local dollar store can fill these baskets with all kinds of health and beauty items.
