The Spirit Works in Mysterious Ways... and through whatever we're going through...

I will confess, my daily routine used to be rushed; and often my last priority was a daily spiritual practice. Yes, I knew that a daily devotional activity was important, and I knew as a pastor, I should be modeling a daily spiritual practice for my congregations. But I skipped it way too often.


Then this virus threatened our lives and changed our world. And I remembered Luther's quote that the Word should both comfort and afflict. And I needed some of that "comforting" Luther was referring to so I turned to the daily devotional readings from church. (They are coordinated with the Sunday readings.) And I offered an online daily devotional based on those readings.

And that's where and how the Spirit worked for me: Every day the daily devotional reading spoke to what I was going through. Every day the devotional reading was clear, concise and relevant. Every day the scripture fit in and informed me that God was with us. It seems as if one day the Psalm has the Israelites expressing praise and asking help from God in the same way we are. Other days, the readings reassure us that God is with us, here and now. Some days the readings remind us of the promises of God. Last week, they reminded me that God always keeps his promises. Magic? Coincidence? I rather think it's the Holy Spirit at work through the scriptures. It works for me!

Bottom line: Having a daily spiritual practice that works for you might change your life and supercharge your faith. Your spiritual practice does not have to be reading scripture. Yours could be a quiet moment, a retreat to your place, a cold beverage and contemplation, or maybe an introspective walk with your dog. It could be listening to your favorite music. It could be turning wrenches on a project and praying. It could be a few minutes on that special quilt. I would encourage you to try a few intentional minutes (short, quick and to the point) every day to give the Spirit some room to work. It changed my faith!




