FROM THE PASTOR: Hey Jude- A quick lesson from the book of Jude

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior. May this find you well. I read from the book of Jude for a daily devotion earlier this week, and it offers some serious relevance to our lives in 2020. I thought I would share. Here's Jude 1:17-25:

But you, beloved, must remember the predictions of the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ; for they said to you, "In the last time there will be scoffers, indulging their own ungodly lusts." It is these worldly people, devoid of the Spirit, who are causing divisions. But you, beloved, build yourselves up on your most holy faith; pray in the Holy Spirit; keep yourselves in the love of God; look forward to the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life. And have mercy on some who are wavering; save others by snatching them out of the fire; and have mercy on still others with fear, hating even the tunic defiled by their bodies.

Now to him who is able to keep you from falling, and to make you stand without blemish in the presence of his glory with rejoicing, to the only God our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, power, and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen.


The book of Jude is the last book of the New Testament before Revelation. It is also the shortest book of the NT; it only has one chapter and only 125 verses. It is attributed to a Judas and the name was changed to Jude to avoid confusion with Judas Iscariot. Wait, there is more. Some scholars claim the writer Jude is the brother of James, who was the brother of Jesus. Other scholars claim Jude is the brother of another James.

While there is some interesting debate as to who the author of Jude is, the message of Jude is quite clear. While Jude's writing is small, it proves when it comes to God's love for people, there is no such thing as small and unimportant.

Jude starts out with praising God's people for being faithful. He explains that there is danger in false teachings and how they would lead the faithful to behave. He goes on to offer ways to help others who have been led astray. And he finishes by telling the faithful what they (or we) most want and need to hear; that God is able to keep us safe from falling into false teachings, and that God is able to rescue us from False teachings.

For those of us feeling the bite, crunch, and fear of 2020 and COVID, Jude relays a powerful, reassuring message in three parts. First, It is dangerous out there. Second, take care of each other. And third, keep the faith, God will take care of us.

People of faith, hear the words of God: It's dangerous out there. Take care of each other. Keep the faith, God will take care of us. Amen.
