FROM THE PASTOR: "It Was Impossible For Him To Be Held in Its Power"

I have read or heard this particular scripture (Acts 2:14-24) more than a few times, and I never really appreciated or caught hold of the power and importance of the last few lines until a few days ago. I would like to share that with you.

First, this is obviously from the second chapter of Acts. By this time, Jesus has been crucified, resurrected, and has visited and departed from the disciples and followers. They (disciples and followers) are gathered in an "upper room" in Jerusalem, and they are talking about what they have seen.

And, while there are Jews from all over the near middle east (who speak different languages) in the upper room, each of them can hear and understand the speakers in their own language. They are "amazed and perplexed" at this and some of them go so far as to say the speakers are "drunk with new wine". To which Peter replies, "They are not three sheets to the wind, it's only nine in the morning". (Yes, I paraphrased that, and yes, when we read this in church I am certain there are some who are thinking... "why can't they be drinking at 9 in the morning?...)

Okay, so two things follow that I think are most important. First, Peter explains that everything they have seen (Jesus being ratted out by Judas, the baseless accusations of the chief priests and elders, the show trial, the crucifixion, and the resurrection) are all part of God's planso that any of us who call on Jesus will be given salvation and eternal life. God planned this. Everything went according to God's plan.

The second thing that follows is so important, it is the basis of our faithin that God freed Jesus from death because it was impossible for Jesus to be held in death's power. It means God is more powerful than even death.


Think about that- because if God is more powerful than death, then God is more powerful than everything, and that idea becomes more than a Sunday school lesson. It becomes a way to live.

It means God is more powerful than evil. More powerful than injustice. More powerful than hate. More powerful than the folks of this world who have hardened their hearts against the

- Donate reusable grocery bags, or even sturdy plastic ones
