FROM THE PASTOR: "Lord, to whom shall we go?" The Reverend Heinz D. Raidel

I enjoyed a midweek conversation this week. A member was commenting that we had been reading Gospel lessons for several weeks in a row that were about Jesus being the bread of life. I humorously said at one point that even the Judeans grew tired of hearing of "bread of life" and they were leaving the Jesus movement. That was actually the case for the reading on Aug 22, (John 6:56-69) when the disciples reported to Jesus that many of the listeners were leaving. They were tired, and hearing Jesus explain that he was the bread of life time and again was too much for them. They did not like what they were hearing, and they left.

Talk about a relevant scripture! We have lost our share of people at every level of church, including from our own congregations over the past year. (Statistics show us to be about par with other churches as far as people attending now vs. attending pre-March 2020.) We are obviously at a point where membership and giving requires serious thought and intentional action. It is a good time to remember that the number one factor in congregational growth is how much members invite their friends and relatives to worship. It's also a good time to remember that the "Jesus movement" did not roll over and fade away when his 12 informed him that others were leaving. Jesus asked the 12... "Will you leave me also?"


"Leave?" Peter said. "Where would we go, you have the words of eternal life;" and those 12 did not leave (except for Judas); So no, the first disciples did not leave, rather they stuck close to Jesus at first. Then they had a few rough roads and they had their share of challenges. They watched in disbelief and with little understanding as Jesus was crucified in front of them. They scattered, but they did not leave. They didn't leave even after Jesus was buried, although they did lock themselves in a room, where they did see and hear the risen Jesus. They knew who had the words of eternal life.

Then, they went out after Jesus left, and they shared the words of eternal life with the world. I can't help but think Jesus' question "will you too leave me" was more rhetorical than anything else. I wonder if Jesus asked the question just to make a point, that is, that the 12 (except for Judas) were just not leaving.

I hope and pray that we can be like the 12- I hope we can stand and say "where would we go, you have the words of eternal Continued on p. 2

life," because we have some challenges ahead of

us. We're going to have to adapt to survive. We're going to have to do some things differently. We're going to have to accept some changes. We are certainly going to go through a period of finding out what works, not just for us, but for the folks we invite to share our worship.

We can make church work. I want to share that we will make our church and our congregation work- we are the only people in town who preach and proclaim a no holds barred God of love and mercy and inclusion. We are the ones who share a Jesus of the poor, and sick, and needy. We're the ones who preach a Jesus who comes to us and stays with us when we need him the most, even when we're at our worst. We're the ones- the Lutheranswho hold up a Jesus who dies for everyone and not just those who think they are good enough. We preach and proclaim through word and deed- we hold Jesus up as the word of eternal life. We are part of the light John talks about, which the darkness can not put out.

Are we, as people of Faith going to leave? Hardly, we're going to stick around and tell the world about the guy who has the words of eternal life. Alleluia, Alleluia!

A few notes from the Treasurer:

- 1 sturdy comb (no picks or fine toothed please)
- 1 metal nail clippers

(These items will be wrapped at church).

SCHOOL KITS:

**We need as many additional notebooks as possible, to match with leftover items so we can complete more kits.

- (4)70-80 sheet notebooks (8.5"x11", wide/college ruled)
- 1 ruler with cm and inches.
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 steel blade, blunt scissors
- 5 unsharpened, #2 pencils w/ erasers
- 5 black or blue ballpoint pens wrapped with rubber band
- 1 box 24 count crayons
- (1) 2.5 inch pink eraser
