We NEED 30, dark colored bath towels to complete the kits we have now.


SCHOOL KITS:

- (4)70-80 sheet notebooks (8.5"x11", wide/college ruled)
- 1 ruler with cm and inches.
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 steel blade, blunt scissors
- 5 unsharpened, #2 pencils w/ erasers
- 5 black or blue ballpoint pens wrapped with rubber band
- 1 box 24 count crayons
- (1) 2.5 inch pink eraser

**We need as many additional notebooks as possible, to match with leftover items so we can complete more kits. (We will supply the backpacks.)

All kits must be at the church by Sept.30th. The kits then get sent on to St. Luke's Lutheran Church where they will all be packed on Oct. 1st.,from 10am-1pm. Please plan on joining us if you can! Thank you!
