
Inside this issue:

A Note from your no so "old" treasurer:

Greetings to the Grace Congregational family, WOW! Another year has gone by in the blink of an eye; at least it seems so. Our children and our grandchildren became another year older. Well, and, come to think of it, with all those years flashing by, we all have become "older."

Taxes are coming up, and we are all looking to not be so generous in sharing our money by paying taxes. Your kindness and generosity have allowed Grace Lutheran Church to remain a vital, caring community focused on the Good News of Jesus this year. And, we are very grateful for your generosity to the ministry of Grace in 2022! Thank you. But there is still more to do in 2023!

So here is something to think about if you are 70.5 years old or older. And if you have not quite reached that age, here is something to think about when the grandkids do call you "OLD."

If you are 70.5 years old or older and have a traditional IRA, 401(k) or 403(b), you are eligible to make a contribution directly from your retirement account to a charity (Grace) and have it count as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). This will result in no income tax due to you, as you won't be taking it as a distribution to you. So you avoid income taxes, get to make a gift to charity (Grace), and have it count as your Required Minimum Distribution (this is a thing once you are 72). If you are 70.5 years old and have a traditional IRA, 401(k) or 403(b), this is almost always the best way to give.

Please consider using your generosity to support your church home.

Thank you for all the ways in which you support Grace Ev. Lutheran Church. Thank you for considering a special gift at the end of the year and all year through to keep our Grace ministry thriving!


