LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH


P: The first three candles we lit were for hope, peace, and joy. Today we light the fourth candle--the candle of LOVE. With this flame we signify the love of God that surrounds and fills us at all time, but that we recognize ina special way in the Christmas story. There is no greater power than LOVE. It is stronger than rulers and empires, stronger than grief or despair, stronger than even death. We love, because God LOVES us.

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BRIEF ORDER FOR CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS



THE WORD

THE FIRST READING: Micah 5:2-5a

The prophet Micah, having pronounced judgment upon Judah, speaks of a future shepherd-king who, like David, will come from the small town of Bethlehem. (Ephrathah refers to the area around Bethlehem.) This king will restore Israel and bring peace. New Testament writers understood this passage to be referring to Jesus.

²But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah,

who are one of the little clans of Judah,

from you shall come forth for me

one who is to rule in Israel,

whose origin is from of old,

from ancient days.

³ Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has brought forth;

then the rest of his kindred shall return

to the people of Israel.

⁴ And he shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God.

And they shall live secure, for now he shall be great

to the ends of the earth;

^{5a} and he shall be the one of peace.

PSALM: Luke 1:46b-55

^{46b} My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord,

⁴⁷ my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

⁴⁸ for you, Lord, have looked with favor on your lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed:

⁴⁹ you, the Almighty, have done great things for me

and holy is your name.

⁵⁰ You have mercy on those who fear you, from generation to generation.

⁵¹ You have shown strength with your arm and scattered the proud in their conceit,

- ⁵³ You have filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away empty.

SECOND READING: Hebrews 10:5-10

The author of Hebrews uses the image of religious sacrifice to convey the significance of Christ's coming. Through obedient acceptance of God's will, Christ allows his own body to become the greatest sacrifice of all, one through which we are made a holy people.

⁵ Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said,


"Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired,

- but a body you have prepared for me;
- ⁶ in burnt offerings and sin offerings
- you have taken no pleasure.
- ⁷ Ťhen I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God'
- (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)."

⁸ When he said above, "You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), ⁹ then he added, "See, I have come to do your will." He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. ¹⁰ And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.



P: Blessed are you, O holy God; your grace is designed into all things. Your universe expands into unending love.



P: Let us pray as Jesus taught us:


